Notes:

- 1. To complete this credit requirement, students may take additional study load in the first two years, or complete at least 132 credits in the first two years <u>and</u> up to 24 credits of courses at HKU in the summer semesters of Years 3 and 4.
- 2. Students who have not studied the Chinese language during their secondary education or who have not attained the requisite level of competence in the Chinese language to take CART9001 may apply for exemption and take an elective course in lieu.
- 3. The following Arts majors are applicable to this Dual Degree:

- 4. Students may not be able to complete the capstone experience of the declared Arts major in Year 2. In this case, they can take the capstone experience of independent research nature (6-12 HKU credits) in Year 3 or 4 under remote supervision of the relevant programme at HKU. They can undertake the course in Semester 1 and/or Semester 2 but the enrollment will be recorded in the summer semester of that academic year on their HKU transcripts.
- 5. Students should complete at least 50% of the course requirements of their declared major/minor at HKU (i.e. the maximum credits can be transferred to a major is 36; that to a minor is 18). If they plan to fulfil the remaining requirements by completing the relevant free electives at UCB, they should submit an application for credit transfer⁷ for processing. Similar to the requirements of majors, students should comply with the syllabus of the declared minor at HKU for their HKU degree.
- 6. Language majors and minors at HKU require students to complete 6 language progression courses spanned in 3 years. Students are advised to check in advance whether third-year language courses of equivalent level will be offered at UCB.
- 7. Double-counting of courses for fulfilling more than a major and/or a minor at HKU is not allowed. Please refer to <u>Useful Forms</u> for the guidelines and procedures of applying credit transfer.
- 8. Courses counted towards a HKU major will not be counted towards another major/minor at UCB. For example, it normally takes 12 courses to complete a Comparative Literature (CLIT) major at HKU but students will be required to take more than 12 relevant courses during their degree studies if they plan to pursue a CLIT major at HKU and a Film major/minor at UCB. Similarly, courses counted towards a HKU minor will not be counted towards another major/minor at UCB.
- 9. Students are required to submit a study plan to both HKU and UCB and obtain prior approval at the beginning of Years 2, 3 and 4.
