

where your PKM system will be developed on during the workshops The Personal Knowledge Management (PKM) for Academic Success is designed to help new BA(HDT) students develop critical digital and information literacy skills in an era of rapidly changing literacy demands.

The series of three workshops will support you as you develop your own PKM systems, or "second brains" using a range of organisational strategies and technical tools which, when applied in your studies, will enable you to control how you consume, organise and synthesise digital resources. You will learn data management and digital literacy skills which will be essential for success in your degree. You will engage in peer consultations as you design and develop your own digital learning spaces. Upon completion, you will be eligible for 1 out-of-class learning credit.

Upon completion of the program, you will be able to:

- build and create within a wiki-based authoring environment to design your own personal learning dashboard and manage them with relational databases;
- find and identify resources from the HKU digital learning environment;
- discuss and develop your own personal learning strategies for searching, consuming, sorting, analyzing, and presenting digital resources to optimize learning and sharing throughout your academic career and beyond;

 attend one-to-one consultations to reflect and plan your BA(HDT) learning strategies.
