FROM POVERTY TO POSSIBILITY

Nelly Cheboi left a lucrative software engineering job in Chicago in 2019 to build computer labs for Kenyan schoolchildren. In 2022, she was named CNN Hero of the Year.

Growing up in poverty, Cheboi experienced firsthand the challenges of limited educational resources. A full scholarship to Augustana College in the U.S. changed her path, but she arrived with no computer skills. Determined to learn, she mastered touch-typing and coding—skills that would later shape her mission.

While working in the software industry, she noticed companies discarding valuable computers. In 2018, she began personally transporting donated devices to Kenya. A year later, she co-founded TechLit Africa, a nonprofit that provides digital education to young learners.

Through innovation and strategic partnerships, Cheboi empowers students with coding, graphic design, and digital skills, proving that access to technology can unlock opportunities and shape a brighter future.



LEARNING IN SECRET

Erfanullah Abidi is a global changemaker dedicated to education and youth empowerment. A UNESCO Adelaide Human Rights Award recipient, he blends activism with strategic leadership to drive meaningful change.

Born in Kabul, Abidi defied Afghanistan's educational restrictions by creating an underground school for girls during Taliban rule. These secret classrooms became sanctuaries of resistance, providing hope and learning despite oppressive barriers.

With experience in NATO and Afghanistan's Ministry of Interior Affairs, Abidi specialises in conflict resolution, educational policy, and community development. His academic background in social entrepreneurship and international development strengthens his transformative work.

Through innovative programs and strategic partnerships, Abidi continues to create sustainable opportunities for vulnerable youth. His work proves that education transcends political barriers, empowering the next generation to shape a better future.



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
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THE POWER OF A VOICE

Charlotte Yeung is a UN Youth Disarmament Champion, activist, and author dedicated to using storytelling and education for social change. As a New Voices on Nuclear Weapons Fellow for the Federation of American Scientists, she was a civil society observer at the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons at the UN and collaborates with the UN Office of Disarmament Affairs to plant A-bomb trees across the U.S. and South America, preserving history while advocating for peace.

A poet and educator, Yeung served as the Midwest Youth Poet Ambassador and Indianapolis Youth Poet Laureate, using her words to highlight resilience and justice. She founded a poetry course for women and girls in Afghanistan and later taught at an underground school under Taliban rule. As a Frederick Douglass Fellow, she performed poetry at the U.S. Ambassador's Residence in Dublin, exploring systemic oppression and leadership.

In 2025, her multilingual poem will be sent to the moon via the Lunar Codex, etching her words among the stars. Currently, she studies Political Science at Freie Universität, Bristol University, Waseda University, and Purdue University, focusing on advocacy, education, and the arts.



HOW SMALL ACTS CREATE BIG IMPACT

Jeff Rotmeyer has turned compassion into a force for social change in Hong Kong. As the founder and CEO of ImpactHK and Love 21 Foundation, he is dedicated to supporting the city's homeless community.

What began as offering sandwiches and conversation has become a comprehensive organisation providing relief and dignity. Through ImpactHK, Rotmeyer has helped hundreds rebuild their lives with shelter, food, job training, and mental health support.

His approach combines immediate aid with long-term rehabilitation, challenging stereotypes and recognising the worth of every individual. Rotmeyer's work proves that small acts of kindness can spark lasting transformation, inspiring others to take action for a more compassionate society.



FISTS TO HOPE

Bahir Ahmad, an MMA champion, transitioned from the world of sports to becoming a crusader for street kids in Pakistan. Originating from a background of physical prowess, Bahir redirected his passion toward a compassionate cause.
